INTRODUCTION

One year has already elapsed since we published our previous issue, and this is the twentieth Annual Bulletin. During the period covered by this issue, we have further developed our image-processing system and recording-analysis system for articulatory behavior. In particular, we have been successful at an ultrahigh-speed analysis of vocal fold vibration using a solid-state image sensor. A preliminary application of the system to laryngeal fiberscopy is now being attempted. The ultrasonic analysis of the dynamic configuration of the tongue has also been continuing, and we expect that this technique will eventually provide a data base comparable to ordinary x-ray techniques.

Research on the acoustic correlates of pathological voice quality has been another important project during the last year and we are now well on the way to applying our system to the evaluation of clinical cases with a mild degree of hoarseness.

Research on linguistic behavior, studies of speech pathology and the activities of the central nervous system with reference to speech-language behavior are also quite active, and some interesting findings are emerging.

Last winter, Dr. Kiyoshi Honda, research associate in the Section of Speech Physiology, was nominated as an associate professor of Kanazawa Industrial College and left our Research Institute. At the same time, Dr. Satoshi Horiguchi came back from his 3 year stay at Haskins Laboratries, New Haven, to fill Dr. Honda's position.

As I mentioned in our previous issue, we will welcome the XXth Congress of the International Association of Logopedics and Phoniatrics (IALP) in August of this year, and we are expecting to have many friends from abroad pay a visit to our Institute even during their short stay in Tokyo.

As for the publication and distribution policy of our Annual Bulletin, we hope to continue our present practice of sending copies to research groups in exchange for similar reports or publications. Because of a high rise in both production and mailing costs, we have had to restrict the number of personal copies and we sent a letter of inquiry a short while ago to update our mailing list. Neverthless, we would be happy to provide a personal copy to those who want to continue receiving it. We appreciate your continuing interest in our Annual Bulletin.
